Notes on the Journey

I'll admit that I'm a person that likes to plan ahead. That's probably a good thing for me as a pastor. This last year, baby Jesus wasn't even born yet (Christmas) and we were already looking ahead to Lent. Now here I am, writing this on Good Friday, when you will receive it in time for the second Sunday of Easter.

Looking ahead, though, is really a luxury. I lost a bit of it last year. During the time of my husband's treatment for cancer, we were very much in a chemo cycle to chemo cycle routine. Since his death, I've learned just how depression and grief mess up my perception of time in general, let alone my ability to look ahead much in my personal life. I know that many of you know that to be true as well. It's tough, but it's also normal.

One strategy that's helping me deal with my "looking ahead difficulties" is taking the opportunity to "enjoy the moment." I did a week of that with my eldest daughter as we explored Southeastern Pennsylvania for a week. We checked out a half a dozen colleges, shopped, enjoyed historical sights and wonderful times with each other and with friends. We gazed at amazing architecture. We wandered through colleges, even meeting a bookstore cat at one. We rode in a horse drawn carriage around Philly. It was wonderful.

Then, upon return, the busy-ness of Holy Week crept in. And so did something else...the joy of the Easter message.

Imagine our chapel with sixteen 4-year-olds from our preschool filling the front row. For the past month, they had been learning about Easter through the teaching tool of a set of "Resurrection Eggs." Have you seen them? An egg carton – 12 different colored plastic eggs – each stuffed with an item that tells a part of the Passion story (e.g., nail, spear, rock, dice, linen, crown of thorns, etc.).

They were primed and ready. They were ready

for the last egg. What would it hold!? I asked them details of the story and they eagerly shared them. I reviewed two of the last eggs they had learned – the linens (that wrapped around Jesus) and the rock (that blocked the door of the cave). Then they listen for those items as I read the Easter Gospel. As instructed, they raised their hands when they heard those words in the story.

Together, we saw the stone rolled away. Together we saw the linens laid aside. Together we ran to get the disciples. Together we heard Mary cry, talk to the angel, and to the "gardener" – Jesus. Then together, we looked in that last egg – counting 1,2,3 – EMPTY! The egg was empty! The tomb was empty too! Jesus is alive!

Jesus is alive...I know that in all my life I will remember Jesus being alive —sitting in 16 chairs in the morning and sitting in 16 chairs in the afternoon — that spring day.

There are lots of days ahead, to plan ahead, I'm sure that will get easier, day by day. In the moment, right now, (and in each moment ahead) Jesus is alive, and I am so very thankful. That is enough.

We have had several requests for Matt Buckle's wonderful tribute to Jim Graham. So, for those of you who were unable to attend the Celebration of Life Ceremony or those of you who would like to hear it again, here is Matt's tribute:

When I was in high school, Jim would call me every week asking me if I was coming to LYO. I would tell him I was, and immediately afterwards he would hang up. No "Hi Matt." No "Goodbye" or "See you tomorrow." It was one of Jim's many quirks that we came to know and expect from him. I remember the way he always forgot to shut his turn signal off, or the way he drove his automatic Jeep Grand Cherokee like it was a stick shift, or the way he would be having a conversation with us one second then gone the next. Jim was like a little kid; he always had fun.

Aside from all of his comical oddities, I can honestly say that Jim was the most loving person I have ever met. He had more unconditional love for everybody around him than any of us could ever dream of. For example, he met a poverty-stricken boy named Bino in San Antonio who he cared for so much he wanted to bring back home. Every week he would bring pictures of his granddaughter Dana to show us, and shed tears of happiness when he talked about her. And of course, he felt so strongly for the Youth of Trinity. He would have done anything for us.

I got to see how amazing Jim was every week at LYO. He never judged, and always accepted everyone with open arms, helping all of us when we went through a rough time. Each week I looked forward to coming to LYO and talking with Jim and our tightly knit group of youth. Single-handedly, he brought our youth group up from the dust. More people come on Wednesday nights now than I ever saw when I was in high school – because of him. His overall value to this church cannot be measured, let alone his importance in our hearts.

Now that Jim is gone, we can see so many holes. His spot in the third pew on the right side, his place as the Director of Youth Ministry and Mr. Fix-It at Trinity, his behind the scenes work at Leadership Lab, and his place as a husband, father, grandfather, and friend. We all ask, "Why? Why Jim?" But I pray that we remember not what is empty, but has been filled in all of our lives because of the unlimited love Jim Graham gave freely to each and every person here today.

Congregation Council Minutes March 2005

Report of Survey Team

160 surveys were turned in. The team will analyze and report to the council at their April meeting with a final report to be shared with the congregation in May.

Financial Review

Bruce Peterson reported that the 2004 pledged amount of \$95,00.00 was given to the Northern Illinois Synod. Also given was \$135,689.54 to NIS. This includes Mission Support, World Hunger, and the Reid Estate Fund. A finance committee has been formed and may hold quarterly meetings. The pledged income continues to be below what has been budgeted.

Human Resources

A LYO Ministry Leadership Team will be formed to plan and organize LYO activities. A communications coordinator, Dawn Anderson, has been hired. Also the HR team is developing job descriptions and performance evaluations for all personnel.

Outreach/Witness Team

This team will develop a strategy to determine who are inactive members and how to reach out to these members.

Ministry Leadership

The Executive Committee has been recruiting leaders for our ministry teams. Once all members are recruited, a leadership team meeting will be held.

Continuing Resolutions

Eric Sandburg presented resolutions that outline duties and responsibilities of ministry team leaders. Once all resolutions are completed, they will be sent to council for approval.

Trinity Mission Gathering

April 17,2005 is designated as Mission Gathering Sunday. Team leaders will be installed on that Sunday, and select Ministry teams will provide fun and creative updates on their activities.

Other Business

A meeting for the congregation will be held on April 10th during the Education time so that the financial team can share information and answer questions.

GUEST SPEAKERS ON MISSION SUNDAY

In early August 2000, Rich and Lisa Hensey and their two children were introduced to the Trinity congregation at each of the worship services. At that time the Hensey's, who were members of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Davenport, were about to leave as missionaries to Tanzania, Africa. Trinity has given \$1,000 a year through the ELCA Missionary Sponsorship Program in support of the Henseys during their years in Tanzania.

During their four years in Tanzania, Rich and Lisa were missionary professors at Tumaini University in Iringa. The University serves a central and very important function in the educational system throughout Tanzania as its graduates assume leadership roles throughout the country. The University campus and related facilities were built through the continuing generous support from Lutheran churches and individuals in the USA and Europe.

At different times during his four years at Tumaini University, Rich taught courses in Law, served as the University Bursar, Chief Financial Officer and Chief Planning Officer as well as carried out a variety of financial and planning projects that assisted the University as it almost doubled in size during his tenure there. During her years at Tumaini University, Lisa developed a new curriculum in "teacher training", taught courses in teacher education, coordinated and supervised student teaching, and served as head of the Department of Education.

In addition to their carrying out responsibilities at Tumaini University, the Henseys were involved in numerous projects and activities involving some of the villages in the area. This community involvement along with family experiences during their travels throughout Tanzania, when added to their University responsibilities, have provided a wealth of observations, understanding and information upon which they will draw when speaking to the Trinity Congregation on Mission

Sunday.

ELCA MISSIONARY FAMILIES IN TANZANIA

One of Trinity's more inspiring and fruitful global mission projects is sponsorship through the ELCA Missionary Sponsorship Program of four missionary families in Tanzania, and in addition, individual support for a voluntary missionary family also in Tanzania. In 2004, Trinity provided annual financial support of \$1,000 for each of these five families. The five missionary families include:

Rich and Lisa Hensey and family

Rich and Lisa Hensey and their children Celia and Bennett are from Davenport. This is the fourth year that both **Rich and Lisa have served as visiting professors at ELCT-sponsored Tumaini University, located in Iringa, Tanzania.** This last year, Rich moved from the position of Chief Financial Officer to Chief Planning Officer of the University. Lisa recently resigned as head of the Department of Education and has been coordinating and supervising student teachers in mathematics. In addition to the support provided through the ELCA Missionary Support Program, WMMT worked with the Henseys to develop and carry out several projects involving the University and surrounding villages. In March, they left the mission field and returned to the USA.

Dennis and Meredith Murnyak and family

Dennis and Meredith have been agricultural missionaries in Tanzania since 1983. They work in the area of food production. They are currently working with Heifer International. Heifer International provides a "living loan" of an animal along with extensive training in animal care and good farming practices to needy families. Families who receive an animal repay

the loan by passing on one or more of the animal's offspring to other families in need.

Dr. Mark and Linda Jacobson and family

Dr. Mark and Linda Jacobson have been medical missionaries in Tanzania since 1985. As a medical doctor, Mark shares his time between directing Selian Hospital, community health outreach and a major church campaign to battle AIDS. Mark's inspiring commitment has provided leadership for the development of a surprisingly modern and effective hospital in a country that has very antiquated medical facilities and practices

Dr. Steve and Bethany Friberg and family

Dr. Friberg is a pediatrician, and his mission assignment is "Rural Health Care." He was called to coordinate the renovation and reactivation of 14 rural dispensaries (medical clinics) in the north Massai area of Tanzania. In addition to its contribution through the ELCA Missionary Sponsorship Program, Trinity has donated from the Endowment Fund to specific projects involving Dr. Friberg's dispensaries.

Todd and Lori Byerly

Todd and Lori were inspired by Rich and Lisa Hensey, also members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Davenport, to become mission volunteers at Tumaini University in Iringa, Tanzania. Lori has the responsibility for developing the Alumni and Career Services Office, and Todd provides electrical support for the university as it grows in computer connections. As mission volunteers they are personally responsible for managing all of their own expenses except medical insurance and housing. Should the Byerlys continue as mission volunteers for a second year, Trinity will provide \$1,000 for their continuing support.
